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Factors that currently influence individual ship owners new ship ordering behaviour

- Reasons to order
 - Replacements
 - Expectations of (high) future trade growth
 - Current strong market
 - Economies of scale
 - Energy efficiency
 - Cheap ships
 - Aggressive shipyards
 - Creative financial offerings
 - Nationalistic reasons

- Reasons to order, cont.
 - Share holders' expectations
 - Competitors' actions
 - Sulphur
 - Panama Canal
- Reasons not to order
 - Financial difficulties
 - Weak current market
 - Expectations of low future trade growth

The shipping market: many sub-markets – lots of overlaps & lots of actors

- Low degree of consolidation on most global markets
 - Except for vehicle and cruise
- Higher consolidation on regional and/or niche markets
 - Ferries, ice classed small tankers, tugs ...
- Smaller ships often more regional
 - Regional oligopolies common
- Historic market behavior on regional/niche markets are often repeated

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Dry bulkers

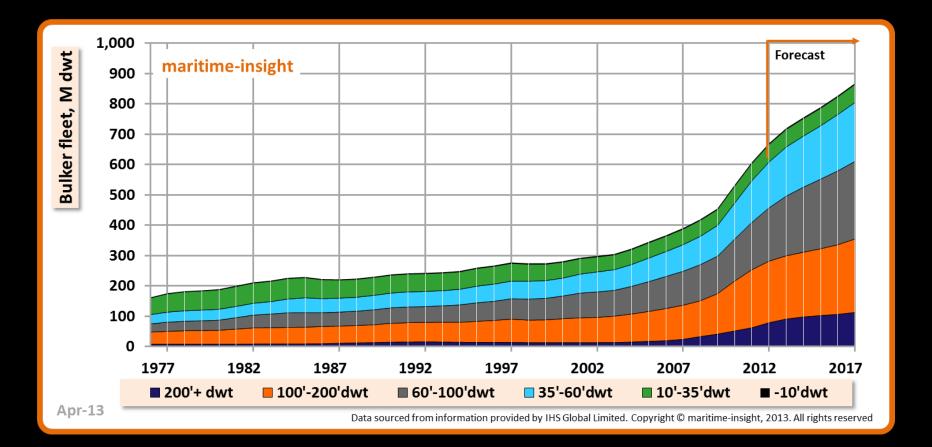
China rocks the boat – imbalance between supply and demand here to stay

- largest freight buyer
- largest builder
- prefers own built keels
- will not pay too much for freight
- For China it makes perfect economic sense to build a few ships too many and destroy freight rates

Bulk carrier fleet development. Continued aggressive fleet growth

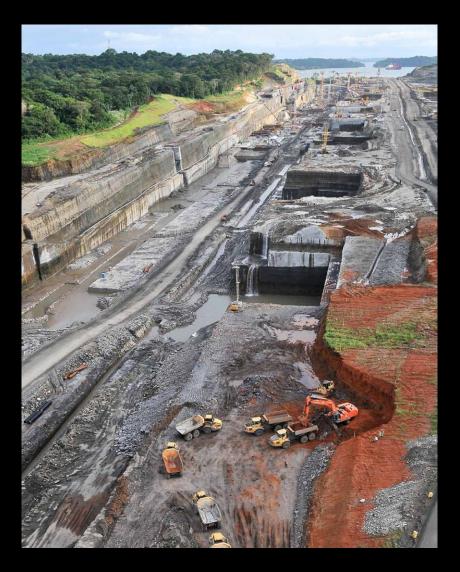

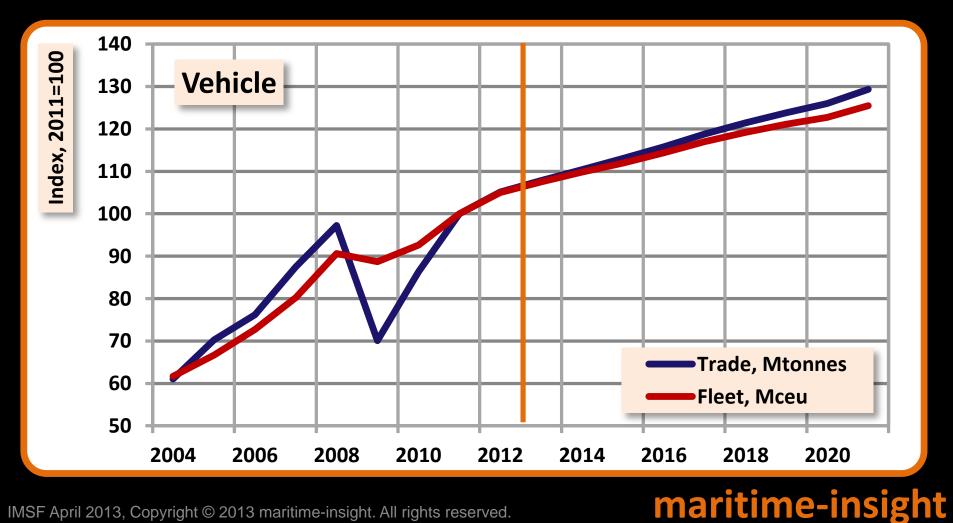


Current status

- Impact on seaborne trade: 4.7% cagr next ten years

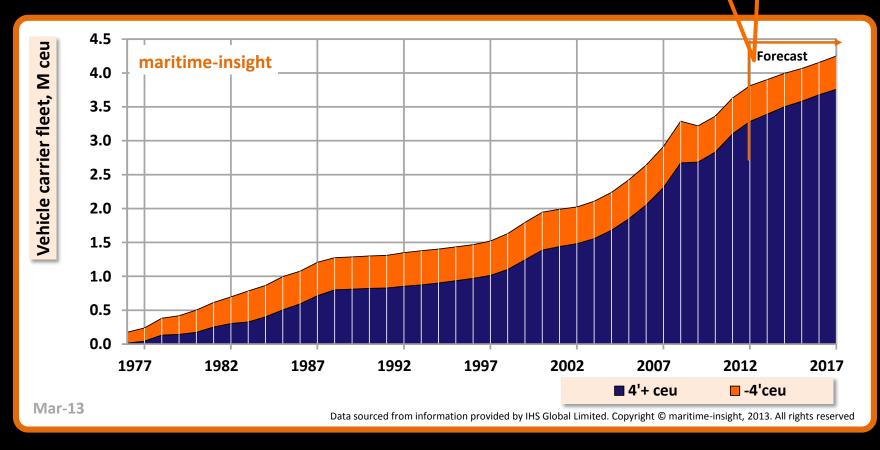

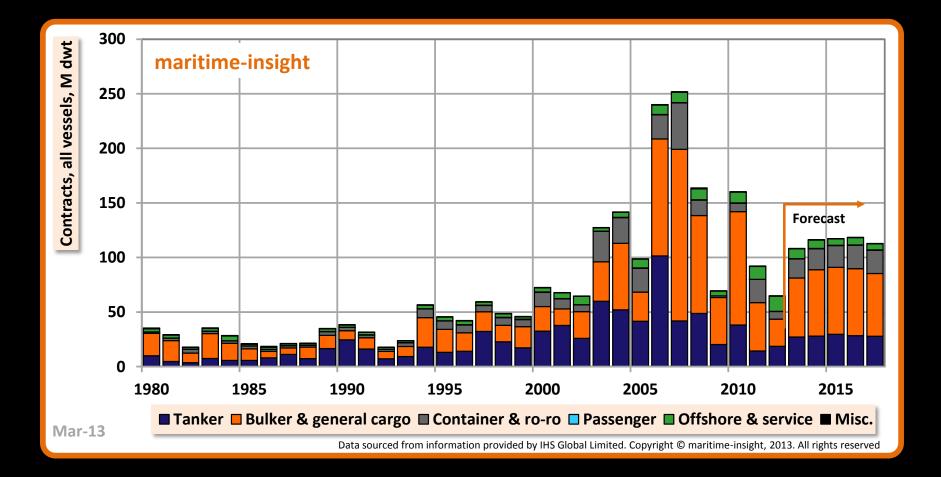
Total shipbuilding overview



New order forecast in the light of the previous.

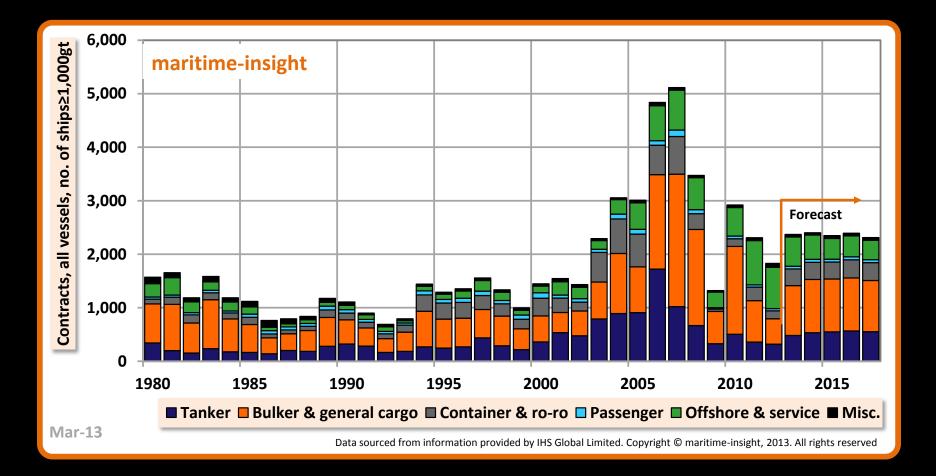

Total contracting in dwt/type



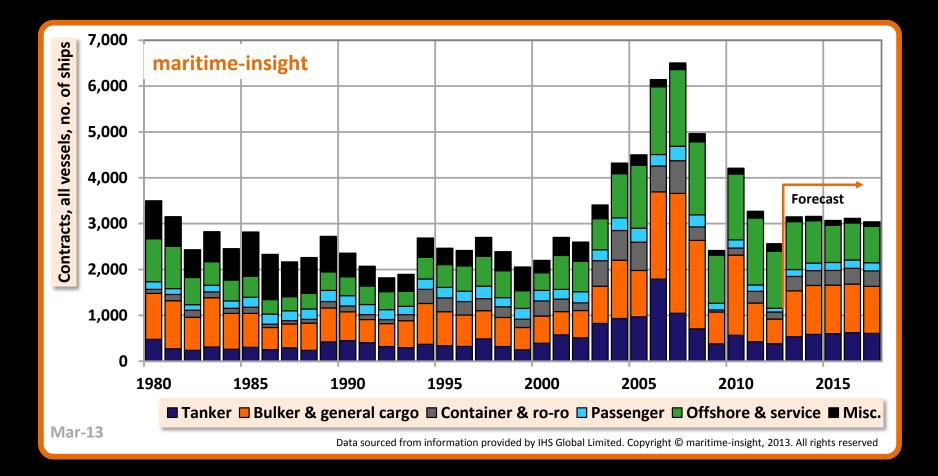
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Total contracting in number of ships, larger than 1,000 gt



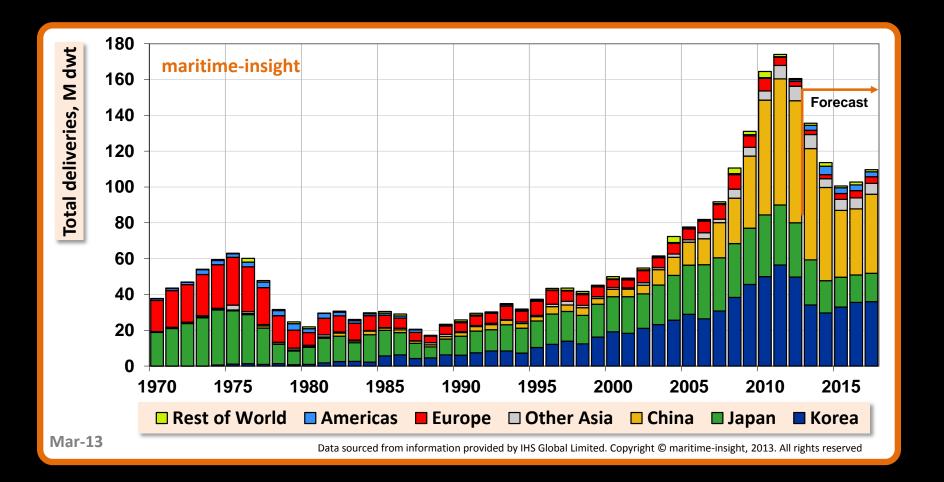
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Total contracting in number of ships



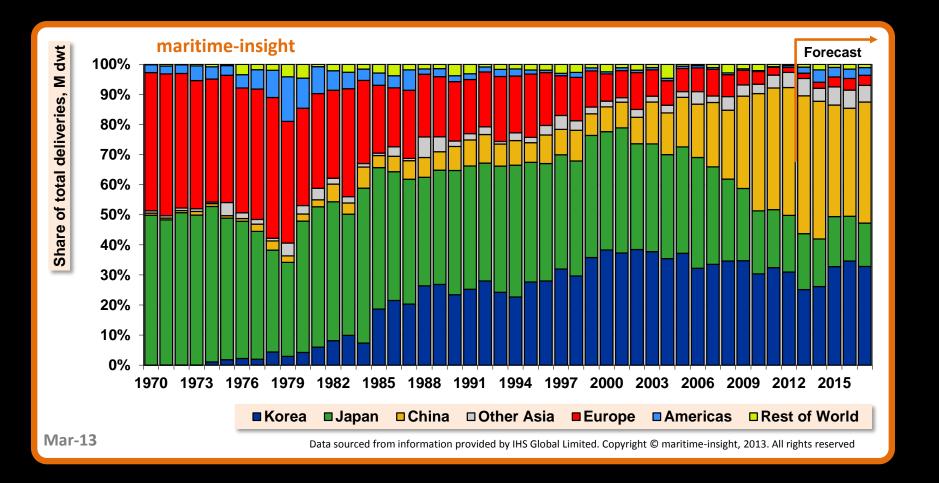
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Total deliveries in dwt
